Class Requirements:



Attendance & Punctuality is MANDATRORY, This is an accelerated course, there are Absolutely no make-up sessions.



Uniform: Students are to dress in scrubs and closed toe shoes daily.

Eyewear: students will need to provide personal protective eyewear; Eyewear must have both upper, lower, and side protection. Clear face shields are also acceptable.

Patients: Students must provide four qualified patients needed to complete x-ray series.

Student must have proofs of physical clearance from own physician, TB clearance, and Basic Life Support (BLS) Certificate (BLS certification class will be provided in class).

Patience Experience & Radiation Requirements:

Students must provide four (4) patients for radiation practice.

Patient must be 18 years or older. Have signed prescription for FMX series from their dentists. Photo IDs are required. A non-paid six-week internship is available to qualifying students (in additional to the 14-week course).

Internships (Optional):

Internship is not mandatory but is highly recommended.

Internship office will be selected by your instructor.

Fees and refunds:

Class fee: \$2,700

If pay in two installments: \$1,375 when register, \$1,350 at class halfway mark (additional \$25 installment fee is assessed)



Refunds are not automatic and must request in writing by email or USPS mail.



If withdraw from class on or after the start date:

If paid in full, half will be refunded. If paid in half, there will be no refund.



If withdraw from class a week prior to the start date:

Full refund minus \$70 non-refundable registration fee.
